



Ware Public Schools Early Childhood Education Program Enrollment Procedures



ENROLLMENT

The Ware Public Schools Early Childhood Education Program invites families to register their child(ren) for the 2018-2019 school year. This program is tuition free with the following options:

4 Mornings – Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday – 9:00-11:30

4 Afternoons – Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday – 12:30-3:00

4 Full Day – Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday – 9:00-3:00*

**Please note, the full day program is for children who are 4 years old and will be entering Kindergarten the following school year.*

If you are interested in your child attending our program, complete the attached application and enrollment packet. All completed applications and enrollment forms must be turned in to SMK.

At this time, all places are filled for the 2018-2019 school year.

Applications will continue to be accepted. Students will be placed on a wait list and called if an opening becomes available.

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Age Requirement

Students must have turned 3 on or before August 31, 2018 to be eligible for the program.

Attendance

It is strongly recommended that your child's attendance in the Early Childhood Education Program be consistent for them to get the most out of the learning experience. If your child's attendance is not consistent, with unexcused absences, placement in the program may be jeopardized and their place be given to the next child on the waiting list.

Transportation

It is the parent's responsibility for transportation to and from the Early Childhood Education Program.

School Year

The program is part of the Ware Public Schools and follows the district calendar, which can be found at wareps.org/For Parents/District Documents or at the SMK office.
