Happy November! On Friday, November 12, 2021, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education will provide the District a vaccine clinic to assist families with getting vaccinations for students ages 5-11. The CDC authorized emergency approval of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine to include children 5–11 years old on November 2, 2021. The DESE vaccine clinic will run from 2:00–6:00 p.m. at SMK. Appointments are encouraged and can be made at <a href="https://ware-1112.youcanbook.me/">https://ware-1112.youcanbook.me/</a>. There will also be an option for those interested to receive their first dose or booster of the vaccine.

Families of students who get vaccinated will be entered into a drawing for a \$50.00 BIG Y gift card (one entry per family). This money is the remainder of the Quaboag Connector Rural Transportation Synergy Initiative Grant left over from the WOW vaccine event we held on campus. With Thanksgiving right around the corner, and if you were going to get your child/ren a vaccine anyway, this may be an optimum time to take advantage of this give-away. Thanks to the leadership at the Quaboag Connector Rural Transportation Synergy Initiative Grant who has provided us this opportunity in securing this grant.
